Health and Wellbeing	<p>Compared to peers engaged in mainstream education, QPSC students are more likely to present with complex psychosocial profiles and have experienced multiple barriers to accessing both education and health care.</p> <p>In 2022, QPSC will continue to develop the partnership with Children's Health Queensland (CHQ) to implement a wholistic model of care. The aim is to achieve greater engagement in education, early detection and intervention for student health and increased self-efficacy and patient activation post QPSC.</p>
